NB Love the words used in trnslation!



I allowed the head to dry for one full day and all joints are tight.

I'm using this wooden strip to trace a pleasant angle on the business faces of the head while leaving enough room for my fingers to grab the handle.

An American version, ending up with a similar mallet, is at http://lumberjocks.com/projects/74269

To safely cut these angles at the table saw, I temporarily secure a cradle to the mitre gauge to support the piece through out the cuts. Note that I'm using the same wooden strip clamped to the saw blade to align this latter with the cut line to set the angle of the mitre gauge.



Perfect and safe cuts.

Here I'm tracing a line with my shop made curve drawing stick to complete the head. I don't mess with ugly tools!




I cut the bulk of the material at the mitre saw and I smooth it out at my shop made disk sander. The head swung in the bench vise, I'm getting ready to chamfer the three upper edges of each cheek with my trim router outfitted with a chamfering bit, but in two passes because I want to minimize burn

After a light sanding and a good coat of Danish oil, my mallet will be ready to be hung on the wall and admired!
