Redwood burl

As you probably know, Sequoioideae, popularly known as Redwoods, is a subfamily of coniferous trees within the family Cupressaceae. It is most common in the coastal forests of Northern California in the USA and is known for being the largest tree in the world. An American friend of the Woodentops Facebook page, one **George Buck**, has posted saying that he has 1000 blocks and blanks of redwood burl, curly and quilted and maple burl, Madrone, Oak and Spalted Myrtle burl. The sort of burl he is talking about looks like this and can be joyous, if challenging to carve. Joyous because the final form can look spectacular, with varied grain patterns, and challenging both because the grain direction is constantly changing, and also as burl wood is generally very hard:



On his post, George also shows a picture of the biggest piece of burl that I've ever seen (burl is the wood at the base of the truck leading to the root), presumably from the early days of logging in California – though not that early, given the presence of the very long chain saw. So this is after the era of axe-felling.


